Each April is National Fair Housing Month and this year it also marks our 20th anniversary at the Fair Housing Council. Now is a good time to examine how far we've come, where we stand today, and how much further we, as a society, have to go. To that end, we are delighted to host the National Book Award winner, Kevin Boyle, as he addresses the history of discrimination and its lasting impact. Mr. Boyle's book *Arc of Justice: A Saga of Race, Civil Rights and Murder in the Jazz Age* is a fascinating story of a court case in the 1920's that set the wheels in motion that would lead to civil rights laws decades later. To quote one review, the book "is a poignant biography, a tour-de-force of historical detective work, a gripping courtroom drama and a powerful reflection on race relations in America. Better than any historian to date, Boyle captures the tensions of ... a period that witnessed the rebirth of the Ku Klux Klan and the flowering of the Harlem Renaissance... the crystallization of racial segregation, both north and south, and the rise of the modern civil rights movement."
